Our deacons have agreed to contact every family in our Church this month, to call our Church family to prayer to ask for God's help in our capital campaign, to ask your family to pray about your response in the campaign, and to pray for your family and any personal needs or concerns you may be dealing with. I appreciate our deacons' help in this first step.

The Communication Phase of the campaign will be in March. Throughout the month, we will cast a vision for our new building, and more importantly, the ministries it will facilitate for our future. We will use printed media, testimonies, and messages to help convey that vision. The keynote event of the Communication Phase will be our Vision Banquet, at Andre's Banquet Center on Sunday, March 29th. Please mark that date on your calendar—it will be a time of celebration and fellowship.

The Commitment Phase is the last step in the campaign. Your family will have an opportunity to prayerfully decide what you are willing and able to give, over the next three years, to help with the cost of that new building. We will ask you to share your decision on a confidential commitment card. The total of all commitments will be announced at our Celebration Service on Sunday, April 19th, the closing event of the VISION 2020 capital stewardship campaign.
