Easter is a time of such HOPE. And hope is so needed in our world today. As we are still navigating these uncharted waters of Covid-19 and all it has taken from us. We are still hearing of more cases, more

And we find HOPE in His power over this pandemic, as well. Our celebration of Easter abounds in the wonderful discovery that

Happy spring! Kids Praise will be having our annual Easter party and talk about the crucifixion and resurrection.


We will then continue our journey through the Bible learning about the different divisions and key passages. During this journey, we are learning about forgiveness and the comfort that God offers us.
