
It's truly an exciting time in our church history as we look forward with anticipation for what God has in store for FBCO as we will be embracing a new pastor to lead and shepherd us in our ministry to Oakville and the surrounding communities and beyond with our online streaming capabilities. It comes with some element of anxiety as we realize we have to embrace change and that is not always an easy thing and to some it can be quite difficult. As you all know, Pastor John will be retiring as Senior Pastor of FBCO at the end of this month. I would like to take some time to reflect on Pastor John's ministry here at FBCO and share some personal thoughts on a few of the many accomplishments through the last 15 years.

First of all it is very hard to wrap my head around that it has been 15 years and that the time has went by so quickly. About 10 years ago or so, I went to Pastor John with the idea I had for many years of forming a Praise band for the services that would include guitar, and bass and drums and maybe violin and other instruments. Some Pastors might have hesitated at this type of change, especially with drums and violin, but he encouraged me to bring it before the Church Council and proceed from there. The unique aspect to this endeavor was that when I brought the idea to the Church Council it was in mind that this was a ministry where we would reach out and potentially unchurched folks would be welcome to be part of the band and play in the services. I thank Pastor John and FBCO for being open and allowing the formation of the Holy Ghost Praise Band Ministry. I think the whole church was in awe as Nicole Kovaluk played the first notes of Ancient Words on violin as we ushered in the Praise Band era.

We have had dozens of people be a part of the Praise Band through the years playing guitars electric and acoustic, bass guitar, ukulele, piano, organ, electronic keyboards, violin, trumpet, trombone, flute, oboe, euphonium, drums (electric and acoustic) congas and cajon and shakers to name a few, along with many vocalist with ages ranging from mid teens to over 80 and it continues to be a vital part of our services. I remember talking to Brenda Hessel one time where she said of the Sunday evening services that it had too much Mr. Wood. What she meant was there were too many empty pews as we often had only 8 to 12 people attend and her desire was to have more come for the services. Not long after that during the January Bible Book Study (which I think was in February) Pastor John decided we would meet in the Activities Area for the book study and the church would provide meals for those Sundays. Instead of 10 or so people we had probably 40 to 50 each week. It was so successful that it was decided to keep the Sunday evening services in that room and continue bringing in food (especially chocolate chip cookies) and it has been a most enjoyable time of fellowship and Koinonia (a Greek Word) for FBCO and an outreach to many others, that their churches no longer have Sunday Evening Services, that through the years have joined us.

Also we have had the wonderful blessing of all 3 of Pastor John and Brenda's daughters Kathy, DeNae and Becky sing solos for services. Becky has also sang with the Pioneer Harvesters at our Fall Festival. Throughout the last 15 years, Pastor John many times would let me know what topic the sermon for the next Sunday was to help coordinate the music but more often than not I was unaware. I am truly amazed at how many times that the music flow fit the sermon topic or a certain song resonated with the sermon knowing all along it was not my ability to pick any songs and I give the Holy Spirit full credit for this happening. What a wonderful blessing God has allowed Pastor John and I to experience. I am so thankful for the wise counsel and many conversations I have had through the time Pastor John has been at FBCO. I feel we have had a very special and close relationship in ministry through these years and I thank God for this. I wish Pastor John and Barb God's richest blessings in the coming years with his retirement as Senior Pastor at FBCO. Words cannot adequately describe all my feelings but I am truly honored to have served with Pastor John.
